Our student placements cover a wide variety of RSPB work and specialisms, from conservation and communications to advocacy and ecology. If you are a student in higher or further education, we can offer you a placement that matches your interests and learning needs.

You could be helping out in any team, project or department across the organisation such as communications, fundraising, education, ecology, habitat management, or volunteering development. The specific tasks you'll undertake will vary depending on which team you join. Placements are available during your academic year or during a gap year and can be of the commitment level needed to meet your course requirements. We will work with you to arrange the placement at a time that is convenient to both you and the RSPB.

Volunteering at the RSPB is open to all. We are committed to developing an inclusive RSPB and removing barriers to volunteering. We will try our best to accommodate any requirements you may have, and we will cover all training, equipment and expenses. What you will be doing

- The tasks you undertake will vary depending on which team you join, but may include the following:

The skills you need

- The aim of our student placements is to help you gain knowledge and experience, so we don't expect you to have any specialist skills

- Enthusiasm about nature and conservation
- A desire to learn
- Confident using computers (including Microsoft packages and Outlook)
- Good written communication skills
- Be reliable and committed
- The ability to work as part of a team, and independently once trained

What's in it for you

- This is a wonderful opportunity to learn new skills, and gain knowledge and experience of the conservation sector. You will gain insight into the relevance of your studies to a professional career.
- You will make connections with a network of industry professionals, mentors and peers who can provide valuable guidance and support.
- By supporting our operations, you will be making a genuine contribution to nature conservation.
